Additional Information

Background

This is the second phase of new housing provided by Kingdom Housing Association on the southern portion of the former Tullis Tannery Site, Alloa Road, Tullibody. The first phase, which was completed in February 2016 provided 27 much needed affordable homes in the area. The former tannery was last occupied by a moulded plastics business. The listed building was demolished in 2000 with the site subsequently cleared by Clackmannanshire Council.
