Funding sources

Kingdom Housing Association receives its revenue funding from its tenants through the weekly rent charges. A proportion of our tenants are in receipt of full or partial benefit payments which are administered both by the UK Government, Scottish Government and Fife Council.

Kingdom Housing Association's employability service, Kingdom Works, currently receives funding through our partnership with Fife ETC and via the Opportunities Fife Partnership. This funding is allocated across four core services as follows:

- Bright Futures - Target Group: Ages 19–24
- Spring Forward - Target Group: Ages 25+
- UK Shared Prosperity - Target Group: Ages 25+
- Working For You - Target Group: Ages 16+
